“VAPORIZED” THE MOVIE, WINS “BEST ROCK SONG” AT INTERNATIONAL FILM FEST!

Los Angeles, CA (March 17, 2017) --ForceField Studios, producer of the Rock n’ Roll film, VAPORIZED, has won best rock song at the 2017 Garden State Film Festival.

“Cracked House,” the TITLE track from the film has been chosen as “Best Rock Song” in the world’s first “Music Movie Competition” which recognizes music in film. The song will play prior to screenings and throughout the festival in Atlantic City, NJ this April.
